Homework Assignment from last Week

Reflect on these Bible passages:

1 John 1:9 Romans 5:8 and 15:13 Ephesians 1:7

Be prepared to discuss this question in a small group breakout room:

• What hope have these verses given you during this week?

How does our idolatry lead us into more sin?

Following the first video about King David, discuss these questions in the breakout room:

- 1. What actions did David take to conceal his sins?
- 2. Who else was likely aware of at least some of David's sins?
- 3. How does Proverbs 28:13 address our attempts to cover up our sins?
- 4. What did David's sins reveal about his idols?

Following the second video about King David, discuss these questions in the breakout room:

- 1. How does David's experience with his own self-deception compare to what we do when we deny our sin?
- 2. What did Nathan do that was so effective in convicting David of his sin?
- 3. How was King David reconciled to God (2 Samuel 12:13)?
