Lent is an ideal time to reflect, teach, and preach repentance and reconciliation. Focus on reconciliation throughout the entire season as we hear again the passion of the Christ and prepare for our Easter celebration. Our reconciliation to God was finished on the cross. We are now Christ's ambassadors of reconciliation.

Choose from a wide array of resources ideally suited for Lent.

• *Go and Be Reconciled: What Does This Mean?* A six-week Bible study on reconciliation, reviewing the six chief parts of *Luther's Small Catechism*. Provide a book for each participant for notes and personal reflection. Order a Leader's Pack to get PowerPoint, videos, and a skit to enhance learning!



Sermon Themes (Sundays or midweek)

Utilize the "Service of Prayer and Preaching" (*Lutheran Service Book*, 2006, page 260), reviewing the section from *Luther's Small Catechism* that correlates to that week's section on the cross.


Introduction to Your Series: Go and Be Reconciled: *What Does This Mean?*

The cross can remind us how we are reconciled. *In our vertical relationship*, God reconciled us to Himself through Christ (2 Corinthians 5:20b). We remember that we are His children, called to a lifestyle of repentance, receiving His forgiveness. *In our horizontal relationship*, we are called to be reconciled with other people for whom Christ has died (Matthew 5:23-24). We confess our sins to the other person, forgive as God forgave us through Christ, and restore others with gentleness.

The Kiss of Peace

Throughout Lent, teach the original purpose of the passing of the peace (see "Moving from the Holy Howdy to the Kiss of Peace." Select Resources, then Free Articles). See suggestions in the article for applying the "Kiss of Peace" during worship.

Pastoral Counseling

Although these resources are ideal for anytime, during this special season of Lent utilize these resources in your pastoral counseling:

- Forgiven to Forgive or A Reason for Hope devotion booklets.
- Go and Be Reconciled: What Does This Mean? and Conflict Resolution vs. Reconciliation At the end of each of the six lessons, you will find application questions. These questions were specifically written for helping people apply that lesson's teaching to specific situations in people's lives. Use during live counseling sessions or use as homework. Be sure to follow up on any assignments you make.
- *Proclaiming God's Forgiveness* pamphlet Use this form to pronounce absolution and for teaching family members how to confess and forgive in the home. Guide family members in your presence through the form, or assign as homework and follow-up.
